

## Collegiate Foundation Ambassador

The expectation of a Foundation Ambassador is to be passionate and willing to advocate for Tri Sigma Foundation's mission, including our philanthropic partnership with March of Dimes. Foundation Ambassadors will be responsible for working closely with Tri Sigma Foundation staff and volunteers to educate collegiate women about the Foundation and its giving opportunities, such as Lucy's Legacy Undergraduate Giving Club. All Foundation Ambassadors are expected to work together to increase undergraduate donors and philanthropic engagement related to scholarship, leadership development and Sigma Serves Children.

### Eligibility:

- Completed at least two undergraduate semesters as of the 2018-2019 academic school year.
- Minimum GPA of 2.75
- Will not graduate prior to May 2019
- Demonstrates leadership within her chapter and/or on her campus.
- Ability to share why she gives and/or supports the Foundation's mission.

### Expectations:

- Ambassador must remain in good standing with her collegiate chapter.
- Responsibilities will include monthly conference calls and project based work related to donor education, outreach and fundraising.
- Demonstrate a willingness to partner with her chapter's Foundation/Philanthropy Chair to focus on philanthropy education and share Foundation initiatives and campaigns.
- Support the Tri Sigma Foundation with a minimum annual gift of \$18.98.
- Be a spokeswoman via social media, philanthropy events, etc. and serve as a role model for collegiate involvement with the Foundation.
- Maintain confidentiality with donor information.

Because Foundation Ambassadors will be communicating with individuals and potential donors, members should be well-spoken and exemplify leadership skills. Ambassadors may be invited to attend Tri Sigma programs, events, and/or Foundation fundraisers.
